46% - find transportation a barrier to program participation and would utilize it if offered

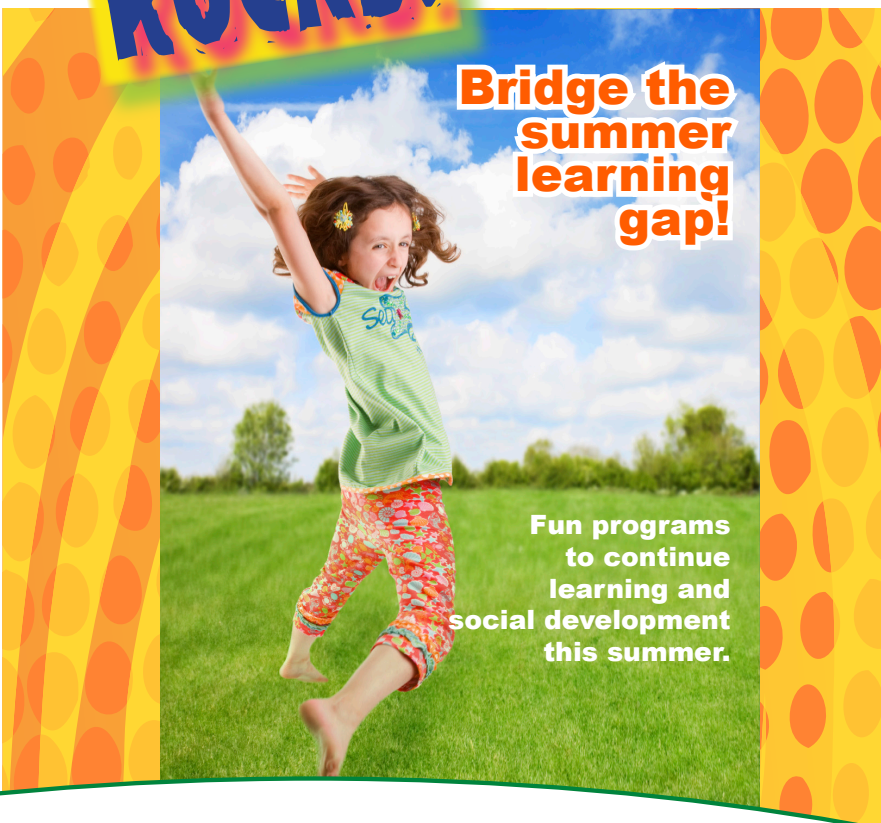
Location
