## **PHY ED NEWS**



### **Kindergarten a.m. –**

#### **Mr. Hainlen & Mrs. Lucht's class**

My Kindergarten classes have done a great job working on their locomotor and gross motor skills. They have been practicing skipping, galloping, hopping, leaping, side-sliding, jumping, and jogging. It is so much fun to see their individual skills emerging at this age! During the month of March we spent a few days on Scooter Exploration ~ fun unit for students to learn how to use a scooter in so many different ways! We did some activities using scooters and music and also had an intense scooter relay where they worked in teams! Way to go ☺ Kindergarteners also spent a few days working on Bean Bag activities ~ students practice individual hand/eye coordination, bilateral movements, and balance. They participated in movement activities such as: Bean Bag Boogie, Pass the Bean Bag, Bean Bag March, and Bean Bag tag. We also did any activity using teams and partners to retrieve bean bags using different body parts that were on a task card. FUN!!! We also spent a few days using Pilo Polo sticks where they learned how to correctly hold a stick and then dribble it from side to side around the gym. We will be working on propelling (throwing) and receiving in the next few weeks. Students will learn the correct technique of overhand/underhand throwing at a target and receiving an object from a partner. We will use a variety of objects to work on their individual skills. Also, students will be practicing batting off a tee and running bases to end the school year! ~ Super Kids day is also coming up on June 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### **Mrs. Carr's and afternoon Kindergarten - Mrs. Haecherl**

The Kindergarteners finished up their rhythms unit learning some very fun dances which they all enjoyed. They then moved on to doing beanbag exploration where they balanced beanbags, tossed and caught them and played a game of beanbag tag as well as beanbag relays. The Kindergarteners then took part in a scooters exploration unit where they moved various ways on the scooters and played games such as "Alligator Tag" and did partner relays. The next unit was their apparatus unit where they climbed up a cargo net, tried climbing up a knotted climbing rope, swung on swinging ropes and balanced on balance beams that were a couple of feet off the floor. They were so excited to do this unit! After this unit they played some fitness games including a game called "Dice Fitness" and "Shipwreck". The Kindergarteners were also able to take part in the school-wide program, "Walk for the Cure". They walked around the track outside during their P.E. time that day and helped to bring pledges in to help find a cure for cancer. Nice job, Kindergarteners! A look ahead: Whiffle ball t-ball, kickball and then Super Kids Day on June 2<sup>nd</sup>!

#### **1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade**

My first and second grade students have been very busy the last few months working on a variety of units. After finishing up our Continuous Movement test at the

beginning of March, all students participated in their Spring Fitness Testing. It is always amazing to see how much students change over the course of the year in their individual strength, speed, and flexibility. Next week we will finish up their Spring Mile Run and then each student will be receiving a print out of their 2008-2009 Fitness scores to take home. In March/April we spent most of the month on our Basketball unit. During this unit all students are introduced to the basic fundamental skills of dribbling, passing, and shooting. In first grade we focus on their ability to stationary dribble, as well as, moving while dribbling. Second grade focuses on their ability to chest pass and bounce pass, using the correct technique, to a partner or small group. My students enjoyed participating in a variety of activities that worked on improving their individual skills. They spent two days working on stations which broke down the skills of dribbling, shooting, bounce passing, and chest passing. They were introduced to games such as Around the World, Pig, 4 passes, and Hoop ball. This unit was so much fun for everyone!!! Great job! The beginning of April we started a short Pilo Polo unit where students were introduced to stick handling. Each student learned how to correctly hold the stick and then practiced using their stick to manipulate their gator ball around the gym in control. They also practiced the skills of dribbling (side to side), trapping (stopping), shooting, and goalkeeping in a variety of game like activities. We will be heading outside to finish up the school year with our Jump Rope, T-ball, and Track and Field units. Looking ahead: Volunteers are needed for Super Kids Day ~ Tuesday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### **3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Grade - Mrs. Huber**

March and April were busy months for the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades. Students worked on a rhythms unit learning a circle dance done to the old "rock around the clock" song and various line dances. Square dances were also taught and the 4<sup>th</sup> graders did a nice job with "oh, Susanna" which challenged them to learn a difficult move called a "grand right & left". Students also spent time learning the rules and practicing the game of 4-square. We have just finished up with one of their favorite units – the apparatus unit! In this unit, they worked on their upper body strength by climbing the cargo net and other hanging ropes. They also worked on the balance beams and were able to experiment with pedometers. Students have also recently completed the pacer and will be doing our spring mile run in the next couple of weeks. Our spring units will include track & field activities and softball.



## PHY ED NEWS continued

### **4<sup>th</sup> Grade - Mrs. Haecherl**

The 4<sup>th</sup> graders have been busy these past couple of months. They started out performing their tumbling routines and I have to say they did a very nice job creating and memorizing their routines. Their next unit was rhythms, where they learned a few square dances and a line dance. Learning the line dance was a little more popular than the square dancing! They just finished up with their apparatus unit where they were able to climb on the cargo net, climbing ropes, swing on the ropes and balance on balance beams while juggling beanbags, stepping through a hula hoop, or shooting a basketball. Fitness testing concluded with running the Pacer and the Mile Run. Many students showed improvement in their scores from last fall. The 4<sup>th</sup> graders also participated in the Walk for the Cure during their P.E. time and did a very nice job helping to raise money for a cure for cancer. A look ahead: softball and track & field skills and Super Kids Day.

### **5<sup>th</sup> Grade - Mrs. Huber**

We cannot go the year without a unit on Hockey in 5<sup>th</sup> grade! We finally had a time to spend a few days working on passing, goaltending and finished with some exciting games of hockey. We then started a unit on Tennis and set up some nets in the gym to practice with. We worked on such skills as the forehand, backhand, volley and overhand serve and played a day of King/Queen of the court! After Tennis, we worked on an apparatus unit! In this unit, they worked on their upper body strength by climbing the cargo net and other hanging ropes. They also worked on the balance beams and were able to experiment with pedometers. We will soon be starting to go outside and work on units such as track & field and softball. Students will also be doing their spring mile run in the next couple of weeks.

### **6<sup>th</sup> Grade**



Our 6<sup>th</sup> grade students spent the majority of March on their Basketball unit. During this unit they practiced their skills of dribbling, passing, and shooting. The one skill that we assessed them on was their ability to demonstrate a right/left hand lay-up.

We broke down the skill and had our students participate in a pre-test where they used a rubric to give each other a verbal peer assessment. Each student had an opportunity to work with their partner on improving specific parts of this skill before the final assessment. Throughout the unit we had a few days of stations where our groups were practicing lay-ups, 5 passes drill, and playing lightening. They also spent another few days playing 5 on 5 half court games. At the end of the unit we had our students evaluate each other's lay-ups using a post peer assessment sheet. It was great to see how much our student's improved on their individual skills with the help and encouragement their peers. In April we started a Team Handball unit where our students learned the basic skills of playing the game.

They worked on the skills of passing, dribbling, and shooting. The skill that students were assessed on in this unit was their ability to shoot on goal. This was a very fun skill for most of our students! A lot of students picked up the skills quickly and worked very well with their teammates! We spent a few weeks playing Team Handball using 6 on 6 games with sideline players. It was fun to watch how intense some of the games got and how much fun they had playing together during this unit! We just started our Softball unit and will plan on using our fields outside for this unit. Students will be working on overhand throwing, batting, underhand pitching, base running, and fielding. They will get into playing games after they practice each of these skills for a few days. The last unit 6<sup>th</sup> grade will be doing is their Track and Field unit. They will be learning the skills to participate in their Track and Field day which is Wednesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>. The events they will practicing are 100 yd dash, shot put, hurdles, running long jump, and the 4X100 relay with batons. We will be looking for volunteers to help run these events at our Track and Field day!

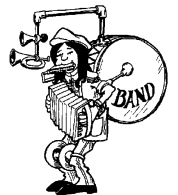

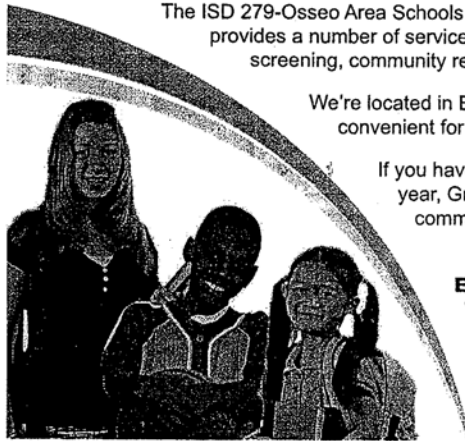
