- Please DO NOT arrive at school before 8:35 a.m.
- K-6 students will enter the building at 8:40 a.m.
- School starts at 8:50 a.m.
- School is out for all grades at 3:20 p.m.
- **Students will eat breakfast during school.**



Absences & Tardies:

Please call the school to report that your child will be late for school or will not be coming to school. If the absence is not reported, it is UNEXCUSED. Please call 763-549-2408 before 8:00 a.m. or call the main office after 8:00 a.m. at 763-561-6870.



****IMPORTANT REMINDER:** When students are absent or come late to school due to an appointment, *they are required to bring a note from the doctor, dentist, etc. for this to be an excused absence or tardy.*

Breakfast & Lunch:

There is no cost for breakfast; breakfast is **FREE**. Students will eat breakfast during school hours.

The cost of lunch is **\$2.00** for a student lunch which includes milk. If a student carries cold lunch and buys milk, it will be **50¢**.

The electronic lunch system works like a checking account. Parents deposit money into each student's account. When a student buys lunch, it is automatically deducted from their account. When the student's account falls below \$3.00, the child is notified. Please send money to cover a week or two of lunches. *Make checks payable to ISD #279, or Park Brook.*

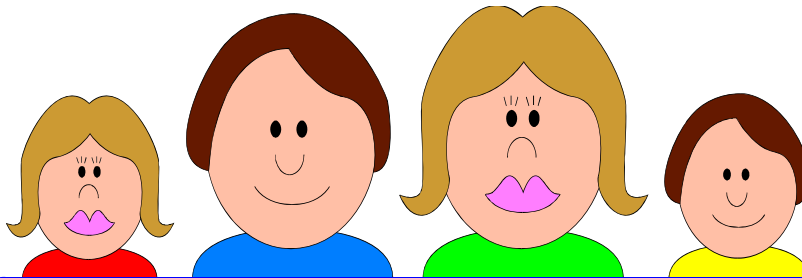
Students who qualify for a free or reduced lunch use the same system but either they are not charged or pay 40¢ for the reduced lunch. Forms to apply for free or reduced meals are sent to all homes in the school district and are available at the school. **These must be filled out EVERY YEAR.**

Please return this application to school *as soon as possible*. We are glad to receive them in August. Without an approved application form, your child will be charged full price for lunch.

WHO IS MY TEACHER?

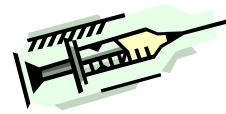

NO SHOTS NO SCHOOL **FREE IMMUNIZATION CLINIC**



Osseo School District is partnering with Columbia Park Medical Group to ensure that every child is up to date with their immunizations before entrance to school this fall. Immunizations will be available for children who qualify for MNVFC (MN Vaccines for Families and Children) for those of you who do not have health insurance. Staff will be available to help determine eligibility.

It's always best to be seen at your clinic by your family physician. However, if this does not work out for you, staff from the above health organizations will be available to give immunizations at:

1. Brooklyn Junior High – August 20th 9:30-11:00 a.m.
2. North View Junior High – August 25th 5:00-8:30 p.m.

- Appointments are not necessary.
- A parent/guardian **must** accompany their child.
- All Osseo students are welcome (elementary, Junior High and Senior High students).
- **Bring a current immunization record.** If you don't have an immunization record, one will be available for students enrolled in school.
- There is no direct cost or co-payment fee to the family. Private insurance will be billed if applicable. (Please bring your insurance card).
- The "Minnesota Vaccine for Children" program will cover the cost of vaccines for those without insurance.

Appropriate Dress for Students:

Parents, please monitor your child's choice of dress by adhering to the following guidelines:

- ♦ **Shirts must** cover the entire midsection, have no language or illustrations that are offensive, nor have "spaghetti straps". Straps should be at least 1.5" wide.
- ♦ **Shorts must** have a minimum of a 5-inch inseam.
- ♦ **Jackets and coats** may not be worn during the school day.
- ♦ **Hats, caps, or headwear** of any kind is not allowed during the school day. Contact the principal if headwear must be worn for religious reasons.
- ♦ **Pants** must be at a length so that the student will not trip on them. Also, no undergarments should be showing.

STUDENT DROP OFF/PICK UP AND VISITOR PARKING INFORMATION

Students may be dropped off in the **SOUTHWEST** parking lot. There are two drive through lanes that lead to student drop off zones and visitor parking spaces. There will be **NO STOPPING OR PARKING** in the two drive through lanes. These are fire lanes, and violators will be ticketed.

If you are **DROPPING OFF** students, you should pull into the zones on the FAR RIGHT.

If you are **PARKING** your car, you should continue on through the lot and pull into the parking spaces on your **RIGHT** as you drive through.

There are two exit lanes on to Jersey, one turning left and the other turning right.

ONLY BUSES and commercial daycare vans are permitted to use the **NORTHEAST** parking circle.

You may also drop off students at Hartkopf Park by driving into the small parking lot in the park across from the school. Patrols will be stationed there to cross students safely.

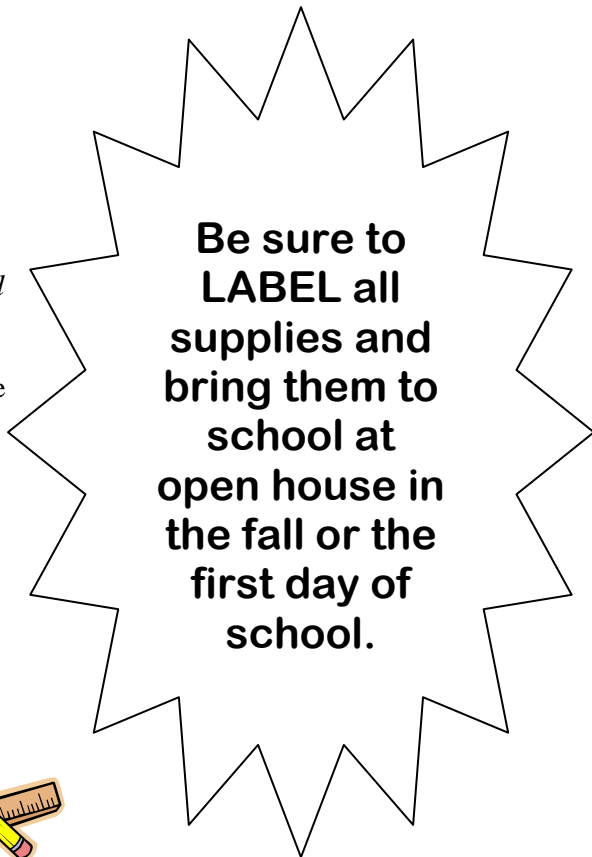
