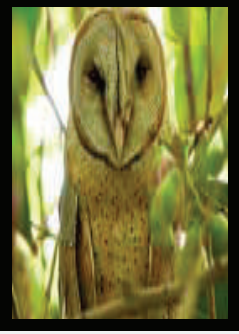

The color of the Barn Owl is white and black and brown with white and black spots. The female is darker and has more spots. The size of the Barn Owl's body is 32-40cm (13-16in) and the wing span is 100-125cm (39-49in). The weight of this big bird is 400-700g and the female is bigger then the male.
