Words, Words, Words

Label an empty tissue or shoe box for word cards. Print your child’s name on the box, for example, Raul’s Words. Your child will add word cards for each new story.

- Have your child cut out the word cards and read each word.
- Have your child use each word in a sentence about a pet, a school activity, or a favorite toy or game.
- Make an additional set of word cards. Place all the cards face down and play the card game Concentration with your child. Take turns choosing two cards, reading the words, and keeping both cards if they match.

Reading Advertisements

Ask your child to retell the story “A Bed Full of Cats” in his or her own words. Then look at the Lost and Found section of the classified ads in the local newspaper. Read the ads for lost pets with your child. Then help your child write an ad about Flora for Lee.
