## Words, Words, Words

- Have your child cut out the word cards and read each word.
- Give your child a clue about each word. Have your child point to the word card and read the word aloud. For example, “This word names a number.” (*twelve*) “This word rhymes with late.” (*wait*)
- Have your child pick four different new words and act each one out. Watch carefully and guess which word your child is demonstrating.

## What’s the Buzz?

Have your child recall some of the things he or she learned about bees from reading the story. Together, make a buzzing sound like the sound a bee might make. Then take turns making different animal sounds. Have fun guessing which animal makes each sound.
