Words, Words, Words

- Have your child cut out the word cards and read each word.
- Ask your child to use each word in a sentence that shows the meaning of the word, for example, “People are *working* to repair the road.”
- Have your child find and read the two words that begin with *c* and the two words that begin with *s*.

Figures of Speech

Explain that “just around the corner” is a figure of speech, or a way of saying one thing to mean something else. For example, just around the corner means “very soon” or very near.” Talk about other sayings such as “It’s raining cats and dogs” and “I have a frog in my throat.” Your child may like to draw pictures of the literal meanings of these expressions.
