Shopping for Words

You can use the word cards to reinforce your child’s understanding and recognition of vocabulary. When you go to the grocery store with your child, bring the cards with you. Take turns using the words to talk about fruits and vegetables in the produce section. (Examples: “That bell pepper is *beautiful*. We can eat this pear when it *ripens*. Coconuts can float in *streams*.”)
