You may want to do some of these activities with your child.

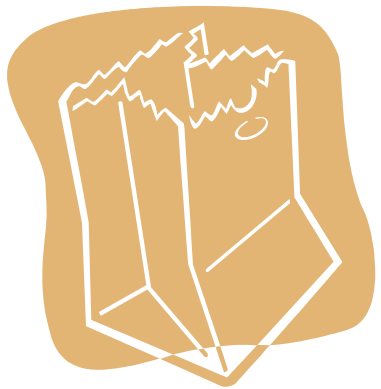
## Words, Words, Words

- Have your child cut out the word cards and read each word.
- Give your child a clue about each new word. Have your child point to the word card and read the word aloud. For example, “This word starts with an a.” (and)
- Ask your child which word means the opposite of out and which word means the opposite of no. (in and yes)

## In the Bag

Ask your child to tell you how Sam and the other cats played in the bag. Then put several small, safe household objects into a paper bag (a spoon, a dry sponge, a paper clip, and a cotton ball, for example). Have your child reach into the bag without looking inside, feel each object and try to guess what it is.
