



- Additional spaces for classrooms, family literacy learning, staff, technology, and storage would allow for increased programming.

What has changed?

- ► VPK funding created for FY 17, 8 sites received all or partial funding
- Additional VPK funding granted in FY 18, with created one additional classroom at EB and fully funded BG
- ► Increased School Readiness and Pathway funds for EC & FE through Legislation
 - School readiness increased from FY17 of 390 to FY20
 (Year to Date) 489 students.
